## **ALP Article from Medicaid Update**

The contract between Assisted Living Programs (ALP – Category of Service 0267) and the local social services district requires ALPs to immediately notify the local district when one of their Medicaid clients enter a hospital to receive inpatient care.

Effective March 1, 2009, the Department of Health will edit ALP claims that are billed while the client is hospitalized. Any ALP claim that is denied, will receive the following edit message: *Edit 00760 (Duplicate Inpatient/Nursing Home, Clinic, Referred Ambulatory, DME, or Lab)*.
