ABSTRACT: DOH announces Long Term Care Quality Improvement Initiative grants.

Introduction

The Department of Health (DOH) has posted application information and materials for a new nursing home quality improvement grant entitled: *Long Term Care Quality Improvement Initiative* (LTCQII). Information and application materials are available at: http://www.health.state.ny.us/funding/rfa/0708140813/index.htm.

The grant application summarizes the goal of the LTCQII project as: "dedicated to improving the quality of the nursing home experience in New York State facilities. The LTCQII will support projects of long term care providers and others who will utilize grant monies, in addition to their own funds, to achieve sustainable improvements that will benefit nursing home residents." As noted below, it is not required that the applicant be a nursing home.

An eligible applicant must be currently licensed as a nursing home in New York State, and be certified as a Medicare/Medicaid provider; or if the applicant is not a nursing home, the applicant will have entered into a project that benefits nursing home residents in facilities certified as a Medicare/Medicaid nursing home provider in New York.

Projects must meet at least one of the following objectives of the LTCQII Program:

- Improve resident quality of life;
- Improve quality of care;
- Improve the use of data in decision making; and
- Improve cross-provider communication and information sharing.

The approximately \$1.5 million in available grant monies will be distributed in individual LTCQII awards of up to \$45,000 per applicant. Contracts will start as of July 1, 2008 and run for a maximum of 18 months.
